VILLAGE OF FOWLERVILLE OVERVIEW

Fowlerville is a beautiful community composed of agricultural and manufacturing land. Fowler is considered the founder of Fowlerville, and its founding is dated from 1836, although it wasn't platted as a town until the 1840s.

The first people to live here were ancestors of today's Native Americans. There is evidence of people here back to the late Paleo-Indian or early Archaic Indian period, or approximately 8500 - 8000 BC.

ORGANIZATION

The Village of Fowlerville operates as a local government unit. The governing body for the Village of Fowlerville is the Village Council. The Council is composed of six Trustees and the Village President, elected by the citizens of the Village of Fowlerville to represent the Village. Village Council Members are elected for four-year terms. The Village President is elected for two-year terms.

Meetings are held the first and third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Village of Fowlerville Offices (213 S. Grand Avenue), in the Council Chambers Room (main level). Enter the Chambers through the double doors at the front entrance of the building. Handicap access and parking are provided at the ramp on the east side of the building (Fowlerville Police Department entrance, parking lot off Church Street).

The public is welcome to attend meetings. The Call to the Public portion of the Council Meetings is the time for citizens to voice their concerns and opinions on Village matters. The council opens Call to the Public at the beginning and end of each meeting, with a three-minute time limit for each speaker. Please be aware of the "call to the public policy."

VILLAGE TAXES

The Village of Fowlerville is located within Handy Township. Village residents pay three taxes during the calendar year. Summer and winter taxes are due to Handy Township. The Village of Fowlerville has a separate annual tax with a separate millage, that is due each September.

GREENWOOD CEMETERY

The Village of Fowlerville, Department of Public Works develops and maintains Greenwood cemetery, located about a mile east and north of the Village of Fowlerville, Michigan and contains most of the Pioneer families from the area. The Cemetery is split into two parts: the original sections and the old sections.

The current sexton is Cathy Elliott, and she has been serving since 2012. All cemetery records are kept at the Village of Fowlerville Municipal Offices. Any questions, concerns, and arrangements for Greenwood Cemetery can be directed to the Village Office.

The Cemetery is open to the public seven days a week during the following seasons:

Yard Waste Collection


Brown Compost/Yard Bags are available at the Village Offices at no charge to Village Residents. Bags are also available at Kodets Hardware (110 W. Grand River Ave.) outside of the regular Village Office hours. Limit of 5 bags per week. Please show proof of residency during registration at either location.

Compost/Yard Bags will be picked up **EVERY MONDAY**, **April 3**rd **through November 20**th, **2022**.
Compost must be in paper yard bags (NO plastic

Compost must be in paper yard bags (NO plastic bags). All bags should be out for pick-up at the residence curbs by 7:00 AM on the morning of each pick-up. Bags that weigh more than 40 pounds will not be picked up. Thank you for your cooperation!

Brush Collection

Brush and branches (NO lumber materials) are scheduled for pick-up the SECOND TUESDAY of the month, beginning Monday, April 11th through November 14th, 2022. The Village is not able to take tree trunks and root balls. This service is not meant for brush from the clearing of lots or from tree removal projects. Brush must be stacked in the same direction, parallel to the curb and no more than 5' from the roadside. Branches should be no longer than 4' and 1"-6" in diameter. Please place brush out by the curb by 7:00 AM, no sooner than three (3) days prior to the scheduled pick-up date. Thank you!



Don't Plow into the Street

It is illegal under the Michigan Law (Section 257.677(a) of the Michigan Vehicle Code) to shovel or plow snow or ice onto any road or highway, or deposit snow on a road in such a way that it blocks motorists' views of traffic. There are two main concerns when residents and businesses pile snow at the ends of driveways and when snow is pushed across the road/street, leaving snow/slush on the road surface to ice-over. Remember to clear sidewalks of snow/ice for pedestrian safety and to keep our community walkable. As a reminder, sidewalks should be cleared after any snow/sleet storm ceases within the following timeframes:

< 4 inches = 24 hours > 4 inches = 48 hours

Don't Blow into the Street

Grass Clippings, leaves and yard debris clogs the Village's Storm and Drain System. This can result in backed up storm drains that flood and/or start to smell from decomposing vegetation.

What Should you do with compost and yard Debris?

Sweep, collect, and bag grass clippings for curbside collection. Blow grass clippings back onto the lawn where they become mulch and natural fertilizer. Rake or blow leaves into a compost pile where they can decompose without odor or utilize the Village's curbside leaf collection program in the Fall.

LET'S ALL GET ALONG AS GOOD NEIGHBORS

Everyone loves a good neighbor. Zoned communities, such as the Village of Fowlerville, have a number of ordinances designed for everyone's good. Such ordinances can be referred to as 'good neighbor' ordinances. The purpose of these ordinances is to:

- · Protect the quality of life
- Maintain safety
- Protect property values
- Prevent eyesores and nuisances

We also hope folks will reflect the common sense found in these 'good neighbor' ordinances. All ordinances have been established by the Village of Fowlerville Council.

Here are a few things you can do to ensure you are a good neighbor:

- Barking Dogs or other long continued loud noises from pets can be heard around the neighborhood. For the wellness of the pet(s) and your neighbors, please bring the dog(s) inside. Sec. 38-35
- Loud music, regardless of genre, is offensive to most neighbors. Whether the music comes from your car or your home. Please turn it down and be considerate. Sec. 38-35
- DIY Projects and Contracted Projects often come with noise. Please be cognizant that construction/repair noises should be between 7 AM and 8 PM. Typically, project work requires a permit obtained from the Village Manager, (depending on the nature of the project). Sec. 38-35
- When walking dogs, please remember to pick up dog wastes and keep dogs leashed. Don't leave dog waste on other people's property, especially the community parks. The Village provides designated receptacles and bags for dog waste care.

Ord. No. 277, § 2(1), (2), (4), (6), (8)—(10), (12)—(14), (16), eff. 1-6-1992)

- Every vehicle in the open on your property in the Village must be operable, plated/licensed and have valid registration. Junk and inoperable vehicles are a hazard as well as an eyesore and lower property values. Sec. 38-96 & 97
- Un-mowed yards are unsightly and unhealthy. Not only do they detract from the quality-of-life and property values, but they provide safe havens for rats and other vermin. Please keep your yard mowed.
 Sec. 86-29
- Please keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice for the safety of pedestrians. Snow-blowing, plowing or shoveling snow into the street is prohibited by Michigan State Law. Sec. 74-81
- Accumulations of trash and debris create an eyesore, detract from the quality-of-life, and can harbor vermin. Residential trash pick-up service is readily available. The Village DPW provides leaf and brush pick-up in season. Sec. 66-65
